

From the Pastor's Desk

Last Thursday evening, as part of our Jubilee celebrations marking the 50 years since the foundation of our parish, a talk on our patron saint was presented by Dominican Fr Joseph Vnuk OP. We were joined by our neighbouring parishioners from Kippax as well as from other parishes within the Archdiocese.

This was a wonderful opportunity to gain a deeper insight into the personality, genius and sanctity of Thomas Aquinas. Fr Joseph focused on the Eucharistic Hymns that Aquinas composed. Perhaps the most well-known is the famous setting by the Belgium composer César Frank, *Panis Angelicus*. (A quote from this hymn is inscribed on our icon of the saint, the English translation reading: "the bread of angles has become the food of all".)

Coming to grips with the theology of Thomas Aquinas is no easy task. While not sidestepping the complexity and subtly of Aquinas' teaching on the Eucharist, Fr Joseph skilfully and enthusiastically illuminated the depth and richness of this teaching.

As we continue to celebrate our parish jubilee, we are grateful to our founding parish priest, Fr Neville Drinkwater, for choosing Thomas Aquinas as our patron saint. May Neville and Thomas continue to watch over us and intercede for our parish.

Sheep and Shepherds

This gospel passage is one of many gospel references and even more Old Testament references to sheep and shepherds. It is an enduring image from the Bible. Much of it stems from the shepherd-become-King, David. When a monarchy developed in Israel it was clear that the role of king was like that of a shepherd, caring for his flock. Jesus applied the image to himself on several occasions, reinforcing an image of servant leadership. The language continues today, with bishops referred to as shepherds of their diocese and carrying a crosier that is reminiscent of a shepherd's crook.

St Thomas Aquinas Parish Pastoral Council Summary of Meeting: 16 July 2024

Year of The Holy Spirit

Fr Gerard reported on the upcoming Archdiocesan Assembly on 18 to 20 October which will conclude the Year of The Holy Spirit. It was agreed that our parish needs to be represented at this assembly. More information of this event needs to be promoted in our parish.

Marymead/CatholicCare proposal

Members reflected on the recent parish assembly and the importance of the information Marymead provided re location and number of units. Members thought parishioners and the school community were mostly positive, and that we should continue with a 'soft yes' approach, noting more details will determine the final decision.

Relationship with St Johns Kippax

Members reflected on the joint session with the Archbishop during his recent pastoral visit. Although this meeting between representatives of the two parishes was largely positive, the STA PPC was concerned that there has been little progress on joint activities between the parishes. It was suggested a joint meeting of the Kippax and Charnwood PPCs be scheduled. It was also noted that we need to explore the possibility of engaging a Sacramental Coordinator to work between the two parishes.

Safeguarding

Fr Gerard discussed options for the confessional, and changes needed to ensure it complies with professional standards. A decision needs to be made by the end of 2024. The PPC, Finance Council, and Liturgy Committee will continue to consider options to comply with standards, with low cost, but also importantly maintain the spiritual nature of confessional.

Pergola

Due to rotting timbers of the pergola in the church courtyard, consideration was given for its removal, as replacement would be very expensive. It was agreed that parishioners be made fully aware of any decision in this regard and that parishioners be encouraged to inspect the state of the pergola themselves.



Jesus chose disciples to continue his work; he instructed them and empowered them. He sent them out on a mission, and they returned. People followed them, because they wanted to hear what Jesus and the disciples had to say; they wanted to be released from the sickness and the demons that possessed them.

There are so many searching people in the world today, people hungering for instruction, good people looking for direction. They may be parents who are sick with grief over the future of a troubled child; a man stripped of his dignity through unemployment; a woman facing a pregnancy alone; elderly people feeling the surge of life leave their declining bodies; people who are angry and confused because they believe that the church is no longer dependable. They are people who are looking for answers and for meaning. They are like sheep without a shepherd, and Jesus looks to us to shepherd them.

In the midst of this confusion, there are reliable shepherds who walk with us in the dark valleys. They are willing to share the dangers through which we pass, even at the risk of their own safety. They do not pit one segment of the community or one theological perspective against another, scattering the sheep and driving them away. Instead, they work to dismantle the walls that divide us. They speak the word that gathers us together. They reconcile us with God and with each other. They may not give us easy answers, but their primary concern is to lead us to Jesus, the one who is our peace.
